






Have you had an interaction with wildlife on your property in the last two years?




Which wildlife do you experience most frequently?




Bear [How frequently do you estimate you have experiences with wildlife?]




Cougar [How frequently do you estimate you have experiences with wildlife?]




Deer [How frequently do you estimate you have experiences with wildlife?]



Racoon [How frequently do you estimate you have experiences with wildlife?]




Is the wildlife in my living space:




A feature I enjoy	30	97%




Do you practise these attraction management solutions



Manage garbage: I store garbage inside a building	28	90%
Fruit trees: I pick fruit before it ripens and falls on the ground	18	58%

Compost: I compost properly and don't add dairy or meat products	25	81%
