3. ROYAL ROADS WATER SUSTAINABILITY PROJECT UPDATE

Members of the Water Sustainability subcommittee of your OPSRRA Board (Brenda Mark, Sandy Barta and Bill Dushenko) met with our RRU BSc. Student Major Project Team, *Pacific Priority Solutions* (Kodi Bowman, Gayle Hatchard, Emily Rudderham, and Victoria Ntomola) on Tuesday July 12. The purpose of the meeting was to review and discuss their work and progress on the water resource database and interpretation of the new Water Sustainability Act being conducted for our communities.

Work has been completed on the water resource database and GIS ArcMap, which will allow our members to make queries and view water licenses and other features geographically using a number of different map information layers. The data for these maps are connected to on-line servers, allowing the information in the database used to generate these maps to be updated as Data BC updates their data. We were given a demonstration and it was great to see how information (e.g., registered wells) could be easily queried and viewed on maps. We have also asked the students to explore ways in which we might be able to link accessibility to the database through the OPSRRA site. A static snap shot of the maps will also be provided as part of the final report they will be providing to OPSRRA as a deliverable for the project. This information is also being used to identify data gaps by the team and recommendations on how these might be addressed

The student team has also pretty much completed their summarization of the new Water Sustainability Act. Seven of the eight parts in the Act have been determined as being relevant to OPSRRA and its members. We also discussed a methodology for their interpretation of the act - the next part of this phase -, which they are now proceeding to work on. The approach the team will take in interpretation is: "if they were a member of the community, what would they want and need to know about water resources as property owners?" Some key messages coming out the interpretation include the need for all non-registered domestic users of water resources (i.e., surface and groundwater) to have their wells and/or other withdrawal means registered with the province. This can be done for free, if registered before February of next year (2017).

We ended the meeting by commending them on the great work they've done so far and look forward to their submission of the final project report and major project presentation at Royal Roads on Friday August 26th. **OPSRRA members interested in attending the presentation should contact OPSRRA Directors Bill Dushenko, Brenda Mark or Sandy Barta. There are a limited number of attendees permitted.**

4. OPSRRA PLANNING FALL CLEAN UP – GET INVOLVED!

OPSRRA is planning a clean up event in the fall subsequent to the successful Earth Day clean up on April 22.

A \$1000 Community Clean-up Grant was received from the CRD and there is a balance remaining in that fund that will enable us to launch another effort.

As was done in April, heavy equipment will be utilized to minimize individuals' contact with possibly hazardous waste. OPSRRA is looking for a few volunteers from our membership to work with the Directors and help coordinate the event.

The focus of this clean up will be the King Creek area, which was not done in April due to time constraints. OPSRRA Directors will check out previously identified problem areas and any new sites that may have cropped up to determine how much can be handled this time.
