## **2. JDF COMMUNITY LAND TRUST AGM SEPT 24<sup>TH</sup>**

**The following was submitted to the OPSRRA newsletter by a JDF CLT director**

The JdF Community Land Trust Society (CLT) has been active for over two years. It is holding its second AGM on September 24 at 7:30 p.m. in the JdF Area Services meeting room.

The aim of the society is to increase public green space mostly in the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area. As a registered charity since August 2014, the CLT can fundraise towards purchasing as well as identify and work with government for the acquisition of properties valued for habitat conservation and outdoor recreation potential.

At the AGM, members and guests can discuss options and ways to go forward. Situations are fluid and the Community Land Trust needs to build resources and identify triggers so that it can act quickly when opportunities arise.

The CLT decided in February to advocate for land at Muir Creek. Directors met with representatives of TimberWest to let the company know of renewed interest from the community. They also briefed the Juan de Fuca and the CRD parks commissions. This August, in recognition of the similar aims, the Muir Creek Protection Society donated \$4780 remaining in that society's savings account to the CLT. Many thanks to the directors of the Muir Creek Protection Society who made the decision to support the Juan de Fuca Community Land Trust!

Regional Director Mike Hicks could see the way for the CRD to afford purchasing park land in the Muir Creek area and was willing to speak to TimberWest about the possibility of that company selling land. However, at the request of the T'Sou-ke First Nation, Director Hicks stepped aside to give the T'Sou-ke First Nation the opportunity to purchase the parcels. Any such purchase will follow treaty negotiations and involve negotiations with the current property owners.
