



Otter Point Rd Shoulder Widening Project

September 9, 2019

The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure will upgrade approximately two kilometres of Otter Point Road (Map provided on page 2), which is a key access point for Highway 14, and an important alternative route when the highway is closed.

The Otter Point Road project is part of the suite of Highway 14 corridor improvements announced in January 2018. These improvements include transit pullouts and a queue-jump lane, safety signs, new Gillespie Road two-lane bridge, Sooke River Road intersection upgrade, Muir Creek slow-moving vehicle pullout and Sombrio rest area.

Rehabilitation Works

The proposed Otter Rd. improvements will:

- widen the existing shoulders;
- improve the existing alignment; and,
- repave approximately two kilometres of Otter Point Road between the municipal boundary and Kemp Lake Road.

Project Benefits

The proposed road widening, and resurfacing will:

- will improve safety for all users of the road, including vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians; and,
- benefit area residents, business and the community.

Project Status

The project is currently finalizing designs, with construction anticipated to start in the late Fall of 2019 and targeting completion in the Summer of 2020.


Pre-clearing work to facilitate the road widening was completed in March 2019.
