Otter Point Rd Shoulder Widening Project

February 2020

The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure intends to upgrade approximately two kilometres of Otter Point Road (map provided on page 2), which is a key access point for Highway 14, and an important alternative route when Highway 14 is closed.

The Otter Point Road project is part of the suite of Highway 14 corridor improvements announced in January 2018. These improvements include transit pullouts and a queue-jump lane, safety signs, new Gillespie Road two-lane bridge, Sooke River Road intersection upgrade, Muir Creek slow-moving vehicle pullout and Sombrio rest area.

Rehabilitation Works

The proposed scope includes:

- widening the existing shoulders;
- improving the existing alignment; and,
- resurfacing approximately two kilometres of Otter Point Road between the municipal boundary and Kemp Lake.

Project Benefits

The proposed road widening, and resurfacing will:

- improve safety for all users of the road, including vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians; and,
- benefit area residents, businesses and the community.

Project Status

The project is currently finalizing designs and working with impacted utilities to initiate relocations. Construction is anticipated to start in the Spring of 2020 and targeting completion in the Fall of 2020.

Pre-clearing work to facilitate utility relocations is scheduled to take place in February & March of 2020.
